In 1974 we were visiting Jessie's parents in Wilmington, Delaware. Jessie's dad was the pastor of the Alliance church in Wilmington. I was sitting next to a basket filled with books, one of which was a very old Bible. I picked the Bible up and discovered it belonged to Tracy Miller, Jessie's grandfather. On the inside cover was a formula for peace: Praise + Poise + Prayer = Perfect Peace. I wrote it down in my Bible, wondering how he had come up with such a clear message about peace. It was not until 1977 when I was asked by the Senior Pastor, Bill Allen, at First Alliance Church in Mansfield, Ohio to preach at our Sunday evening service that I discovered this formula for peace came from Philippians 4:4-7. In the last 44 years I have preached and taught this truth in multiple locations across the country. In 2002 we published the message in a booklet form, and it was made available through Solution For Life.

The truth, though profound, is simple. First, our focus must be on Christ, daily praising and thanking God for who HE is and what HE has done. Second, we must come to the full realization that God is in control, and

we can put our full confidence in Him. And third, we must learn to pray, casting all our cares on Him for He truly cares for us. He never leaves us nor forsakes us, (Hebrews 13:5), and nothing can separate us from the love of God (Romans 8:39).

However, the truth goes much deeper, and is found in the context of the whole letter to the followers of Christ at Philippi and to followers of Christ of all ages down to this day. We need to read and study the first three chapters of Philippians, which lays the groundwork for this truth. "Therefore, that is how you should stand firm in the Lord, dear friends." (Philippians 4:1)

Our standing in Christ begins with God's love (John 3:16) received by faith (Romans 10:17) that gives us hope (Colossians 1:27) and the peace that only God can give. On the night Jesus was betrayed He told His disciples, "Peace I leave with you: My peace I give you. I do not give as the world gives...I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 14:27; 16:33)

What 38-year-old Kristen has found that 28-year-old Kristen hadn't quite grasped yet is while it is true that when we follow the commands God's given us our lives have a much better chance of going well, that does not guarantee that they will be hardship-free, tension-free, or be always filled with sprinkles and rainbows. I really hoped that the peace God talks about in Isaiah 26:3 - "You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in You, whose thoughts are fixed on You" - was referring to my circumstances and relationships. God definitely does give us times of peace in those areas and I'm grateful. But I stumbled across a quote today from Tony Evans that probably better defines what peace is and what it isn't:

"Peace doesn't mean that you will

not have problems. Peace means that your problems will not have you."

Well, that doesn't feel as fun. That means the problems are real, and that sometimes they don't even go away. But if you think about it, which one is more intimate, more loving? To have God just swoop in and erase all the problems, the end? Or for Him to enter into them with you, to sit with you, cry with you, and little by little change your character through them? That takes patience, intentionality, and it takes a plan on God's part to craft the good that will come out of difficult and trying situations. Really, that's the version of peace I want, because it's a peace that comes not from a life free of pain, but from nearness to God, the only one who can give us perfect peace.

supplications for all the saints." As the needs of people come to my attention I have felt the strong impression I need to pray more for God's kingdom work to be worked out and for people to sense His presence and

> hope. I felt that God confirmed this for me while I was shopping for a card for my niece who is going through deep waters with her 14-year-old daughter who has bone cancer. I came across a card and I sensed a sacred confirmation to this truth to pray more. The card said, "Sometimes, we'd rather do something than pray. We'd rather roll up our sleeves and get in there and try to fix things. But when we pray, God does something. Hmm...Sounds like an infinitely better way to go."

I sensed God was speaking to me about what to do when I have no personal power to remove physical, emotional, or spiritual pain from others. Ephesians 3:20 says, "Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think."

Yes we live in dark days. God is greater and His message to me is to pray and trust Him, His love will carry us through. Sure I still love to roll up my sleeves and tangibly support people, but first I must pray continuously for the darkness to be lifted and for people to experience Jesus and His overwhelming peace and hope. He will deliver. Sometimes the battle may be longer than we wish, and in some cases He may change us but, as we trust God, "He is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think." As we live in these difficult times won't you join me as God leads us to pray more about the needs that you are aware of right where you are? ■

"Now, brothers, about times and dates we do not need to write you, for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. While people are saying, 'Peace and Safety,' destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape." (I Thessalonians 5:1-3)

The signs in our world are more and more uncomfortable, as the Bible says they would be in Luke 21:7-10:

"Teacher,' they asked, 'when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are about to take place?'

He replied: 'Watch out that you are not deceived. For many will come in my name, claiming,

"I am he," and, "The time is near." Do not follow them. When you hear of wars and uprisings, do not be frightened. These things must happen first, but the end will not come right away.' Then he said to them: 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, famines, and pestilences

in various places, and fearful events and great signs from heaven."

Some say, "there have always been times like this throughout history." No, never where the labor signs are covering the whole world at the same time. Nation against nation like never before. There has never been a worldwide pandemic. The news cannot even cover all the uprising in the world, the famines, earthquakes, and great signs from heaven.
