# Overwhelmed By God's Love | by Daniel Westlund

I had not been feeling well for about 10 days. Finally, Jessie said, "You should go see your doctor," which I did on December 21, 2021. Sitting in his office, he asked me if he could call an ambulance to take me to the hospital emergency room. I told him Jessie would take me. My oxygen level had fallen into the 80s and by the time I got to hospital it had fallen to 81.

I was diagnosed with acute respiratory failure with Covid Pneumonia. The scan showed my lungs were beginning to fail, and I was put on five liters of oxygen and taken to the Covid floor. I remember the nurse asking me if I wanted to be resuscitated if I went into respiratory failure. I said I would like to live, but I do not want to be put on a respirator.

On the fifth day on the Covid floor, the hospital doctor lowered my oxygen to 4 liters to see how I would respond. That night my son, Stephen, who heard the nurse say, "Mr. Westlund, you may not leave the hospital," was praying and opened his Bible to Psalm 91. This is a Psalm Jessie's grandmother gave to her as a child. Stephen got on his knees and lifted his Bible up over his head and placed

his hands on the words of the Psalm and pleaded with God for my life and Jessie's to be spared. He asked God not to take us home yet. The next day the Holy Spirit directed him to get a bottle of oil and come and anoint me for healing. Having been raised in a minister's home where, on a regular basis in our services, I followed what the Bible teaches about anointing the sick for healing from James 5:14-15, Stephen understood what the Lord was asking him to do. When he came to my room that day, he went through the protocol required by the hospital to come to the Covid floor and my room. He knelt next to me and anointed me with oil, praying for healing of my body. The next morning, I did not need oxygen to support my life. My oxygen level remained at 93-95. After two days, I was discharged from the hospital. I still was very weak. I had lost 26 pounds and began an eight-week recovery period to regain my strength. As I write this article, I am praising God for His strength to love people for His Kingdom and be able to do chores around the house. Last weekend I did yard work and lifted ten 40-pound bags of mulch and put it in our garden. I am thankful for God's healing grace.

and because of His love for you, you already are more than a conqueror. In Christ you already are empowered to have complete and utter domination over the thing or things that you think, or feel, might separate you from His love.

These thoughts we have and these emotions we have that make us believe the lie that somehow God can't or won't love us are rubbish. GOD LOVES YOU ABSOLUTELY AND COMPLETELY! You must choose to put the lies of the enemy about who you are behind you. Submit to God, resist the devil and he

must flee from you. (James 4:7) Remember, when you gave your life to Christ, He gave you a new beginning! And as Paul closes out Romans 8 (and I agree with Paul), "I am persuaded beyond doubt, I am absolutely sure, that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities, nor things ending and threatening nor things ome, nor powers, nor height nor

impending and threatening nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." This thought has sent me on a journey to better understand how to hear, feel, see, and experience friendship with God. I prayed, "Jesus, I want to see you, I want to hear you, I want to understand what you are saying to me in the circumstances I face. I long to have the friendship you promise in your Word." In my journey, I have learned that God speaks to me, but I don't always recognize His voice or understand what He is saying. The first time I heard His promptings in my heart was when I

was four years old at a Billy Graham meeting. People were going forward to ask Jesus in their hearts. I sensed a deep desire to do the same. My mom prayed with me and from that time on there has been an awareness of His love. Even when I rebelled as a teen, He loved me. I just didn't value His love and what it meant to have a friend in the Almighty Lord. Now, a lifetime later, I have experienced Jesus reaching out to me. He speaks through the Word. It is amazing that the God of the universe is always thinking of me and calls me friend. Each day as I spend time in His Word, I feel His love, even in difficult times. There are two voices I hear. One voice tries to entice me to worship anything but God or comes with a lie to introduce useless fear. Christ's voice comes to me through Scripture, songs, beauty that comes from difficulty and gently draws me to Himself. I journal what I think He is revealing related to my circumstances. During my recovery, I had a great deal of time to be still before the Lord. I had an experience that is hard to explain in words. I was overwhelmed by the love of God. I knew God had a purpose in it. Though it was hard, I told Jessie when I got home from the hospital that I was thankful for Covid. God was using my illness to draw me nearer to Him and to truly understand His great love He had, not only for me, but for all His children.

When I was in the hospital, my son asked if I needed anything. I asked him to bring my Bible to me. I love the entire Bible, but I was drawn to read 1 John and spend time meditating on God's love even during difficulty. I have written a book on hearing and discerning the voice of God. In one chapter, I wrote about how God uses illness to speak to us. We may not like it, but that is how much God wants to teach us of His love and wants to draw us close to Him. We live in a noisy and busy world and He says, "Be still and know that I am God." I was still and can't express how much I experienced His love through a difficult time. He is amazing.

A new nationwide survey by the Cultural Research Center at Arizona Christian University (Dr. George Barna) revealed that only 37% of all Christian pastors possess a Biblical worldview.
